

# EDUCATIONAL ENRICHMENT SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Thank you for showing interest in the Education Enrichment Scholarship. This scholarship is available for full-time or part-time students enrolled at an accredited school or program.

## PLEASE CAREFULLY READ THESE INSTRUCTIONS AND THOSE ON THE FOLLOWING PAGES BEFORE COMPLETING THIS APPLICATION.

The application is available year around at the Loveland Housing Authority administration building located at 375 W 37<sup>th</sup> St, Ste 200 or online at [www.lovelandhousing.org](http://www.lovelandhousing.org)

Application Deadlines for Each Period: Applications are accepted on an on-going basis; deadlines for consideration are: spring semester - January 15<sup>th</sup>, summer semester - May 15<sup>th</sup> and fall semester award - August 15<sup>th</sup>.

### Application Procedure:

1. Submit your complete application; incomplete applications will be denied.

### Student Eligibility Requirements:

1. LHA resident or client for a minimum of 1 year
2. You must be in good standing with LHA – ask your housing coordinator for specifics
3. High school graduation or GED equivalency diploma
4. Attendance at an accredited school
5. Willingness to participate in scholarship recognition events

### Required Documents:

1. Scholarship Application form
2. Copy of high school diploma, GED or most recent unofficial transcript
3. Letter of good standing from your Housing Coordinator
4. Letter of recommendation from an individual not related to applicant which includes specific knowledge of applicant's accomplishments. Letter should be no longer than one page
5. Copy of Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
6. Letter of acceptance from an accredited school OR a copy of your most recent academic transcript
7. *Returning applicants are eligible to submit an abbreviated documentation packet; see Frequently Asked Questions #8 for details*

### Payments and Renewals:

The monetary award will be sent directly to the school for credit to the account of the student. If approved for a scholarship, you can direct which semester/quarter you want the funds applied to.

## **SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ):**

### **Q1. What are the requirements and who is eligible?**

A. Applications must be complete. All participants of LHA programs, including Section 8 voucher holders, are eligible. You must be an LHA resident/client for a minimum of 1 year and attend an accredited school. Finally, there is a grade point average (GPA) minimum to meet as well. First-time applicants must have a 2.5 GPA and returning applicants must have a 3.0 GPA to qualify.

### **Q2. What documentation is required to apply?**

A. An application form, copy of high school diploma or GED, letter of good standing from your housing coordinator, a copy of the FAFSA, and a letter of acceptance from an accredited school or a current academic transcript.

### **Q3. What is the dollar amount of each scholarship?**

A. Not to exceed \$2000.00 per semester.

### **Q4. What is the scholarship money used for (books, tuition and fees, room and board)?**

A. The money is given directly to the school and they apply the money to your student account.

### **Q5. What types of schools qualify as “accredited” institutions?**

A. Accredited schools include universities, colleges, and trade schools. There are literally hundreds of trade schools that qualify as accredited schools including, but not limited to, graphic design, computers & technology, automotive, culinary, healthcare, etc.

### **Q6. When are applications accepted?**

A. Applications are accepted all year round. Deadlines for consideration are: January 15<sup>th</sup> for spring semester, May 15<sup>th</sup> for summer semester and August 15<sup>th</sup> for fall semester.

### **Q7. When and where can I get an application?**

A. Applications are available all year long. They are available at the Housing Authority administrative office at 375 W. 37<sup>th</sup> St. Suite 200 or online at [www.lovelandhousing.org](http://www.lovelandhousing.org).

### **Q8. How many times can I be awarded a scholarship?**

A. There is no limit to how many times you can receive a scholarship. We have winners who have received a scholarship several times. As a returning applicant, you can submit an abbreviated packet which would only include an updated transcript, a letter of good standing from your housing coordinator and the Returning Applicant page.

### **Q9. If I get denied, should I reapply?**

A. Absolutely. If you are denied for any reason, you can meet with the scholarship coordinator to understand why you were denied and what you can improve on for the next funding cycle.

### **Q10. If I receive other financial aid, am I still eligible?**

A. Yes. We encourage you to seek out all available resources to assist with your educational expenses.

**Q11. Is there an age limit for applicants?**

A. No. Residents of all ages are encouraged to apply.

**Q12. Can I apply if I am not yet accepted into a school?**

A. You are allowed to apply, but keep in mind that you will not be awarded a scholarship if you do not have an acceptance letter from a school. We need to be assured that you will be going to school and where we will need to send the money.

**Q13. Do I have to attend a school in Colorado?**

A. No. The school can be located in any state or the classes can be taken online.

**Q14. Do I have to go to school full time?**

A. No. There is no minimum requirement for number of hours although part-time students are only eligible for a \$1000 scholarship award.

**Q15. What are my chances of receiving a scholarship?**

A. Better than you might think! This of course depends on the number of applicants, but if the application is complete and all of the requirements met, you will have a good chance of being awarded a scholarship. During award cycles with high interest, additional factors such as merit of the applicant's situation and financial need may be additional points of consideration.

**Q16. Could I be turned down if there are too many other applicants?**

A. It is possible, yes. Starting in 2019, there will be a set number of scholarship dollars for each semester. If there is a large number of applicants for a particular award cycle, greater scrutiny will apply to all applications with additional factors such as individual merit and financial need being considered.

**Q17. What is the FAFSA and why do I need to complete it?**

A. The FAFSA is an application that stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid. There is no cost to fill out the form and can be found at [www.fafsa.com](http://www.fafsa.com) or by calling 866-514-5948. Completing a FAFSA is required because nearly every student is eligible for some type of financial aid. We want to make sure that you are utilizing all available resources so you will be successful in completing your education.

**Q18. Are there any additional requirements if I receive a scholarship?**

A. You may be asked to engage in a recognition ceremony or public relations activity. If you have questions or concerns about this, please talk to the scholarship coordinator.
